**Section 4 - First Aid Measures****Inhalation**

If inhaled, remove affected person from contaminated area and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. Keep at rest until recovered. If symptoms develop and/or persist seek medical attention.

**Ingestion**

Do NOT induce vomiting. Wash/rinse out mouth thoroughly with water. Seek immediate medical attention.

If on skin (or hair) remove/take off all contaminated clothing immediately. Wash affected area thoroughly with soap and water after handling. Wash contaminated clothing before reuse or discard. Seek medical attention. If skin irritation or rash occurs please advise medical physician.

## **Eye**

## **Section 5 - Firefighting Measures**

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### **Suitable Extinguishing Media**

Use extinguishing media appropriate to surrounding fire.

### **Hazards from Combustion Products**

Under fire conditions this product may emit toxic and/or irritating fumes, smoke and gases including carbon monoxide, carbon dioxide and oxides of nitrogen.

### **Specific hazards arising from the chemical**

This product is non combustible.

## **Section 6 - Accidental Release Measures**

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### **Emergency Procedures**

Wear appropriate personal protective equipment and clothing to prevent exposure. Increase ventilation. If possible contain the spill. Place inert absorbent material onto spillage. Collect the material and place into a suitable labelled container. Do not dilute material but contain. Dispose of waste according to the applicable local and national regulations. If contamination of sewers or waterways occurs inform the local water and waste management authorities in accordance with local regulations. Refer to Land Waste Management authority in your state for disposal of diluted product. As a water based product, if spilt on electrical equipment the product will cause short-circuits.

## **Section 7 - Handling and Storage**

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### **Precautions for Safe Handling**

Avoid inhalation of vapours and mists, and skin or eye contact. Use only in a well ventilated area. Keep containers sealed when not in use. Prevent the build up of mists or vapours in the work atmosphere. Maintain high standards of personal hygiene i.e. Washing hands prior to eating, drinking, smoking or using toilet facilities.

### **Conditions for safe storage, including any incompatibilities**

Store in a cool, dry, well-ventilated area, out of direct sunlight. Store in suitable, labelled containers. Keep containers tightly closed. Store away from incompatible materials. Ensure that storage conditions comply with applicable local and national regulations.

## **Section 8 - Exposure Controls and Personal Protection**

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### **Occupational exposure limit values**

No exposure standards have been established for the mixture. However, over-exposure to some chemicals may result in enhancement of pre-existing adverse medical conditions and/or allergic reactions and should be kept to the least possible levels.

### **Biological Monitoring**

No biological limits allocated.

### Engineering Controls

This substance is hazardous and should be used with a local exhaust ventilation system, drawing vapours away from workers' breathing zone. If the engineering controls are not sufficient to maintain concentrations of vapours/mists below the exposure standards, suitable respiratory protection must be worn.

### Respiratory Protection

If engineering controls are not effective in controlling airborne exposure then an approved respirator with a replaceable vapor/mist filter should be used. Refer to relevant regulations for further information concerning respiratory protective requirements.
