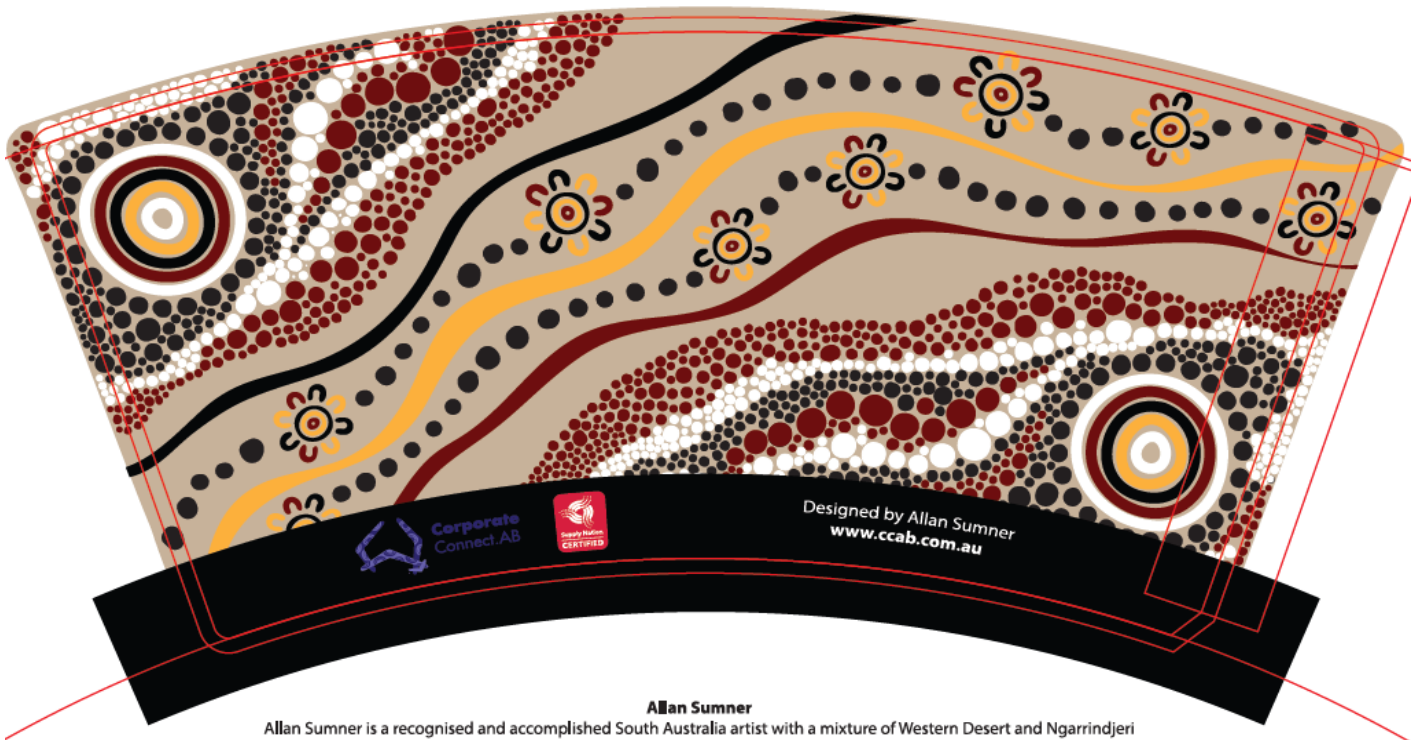
Artwork Description

His artwork reflects this unique blending of cultures, specializing in acrylic on canvas and hand carved artifacts. Over the past 10 years, his work has been sold privately or commissioned by private organisations. He has drawn much of his inspiration from family times around the campfire and fishing along the lower Murray River and the Coorong. An important part of his life and artwork focuses around his love for his country, culture and close connection with his land.
